## The Executive Order on Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad

On January 27, the President issued the <u>aforementioned Executive Order</u>. Included are two provisions which could have impacts on AAFA operations:

- 1. Section 207- Renewable Energy on Public Lands and in Offshore Waters. This establishes a "goal of doubling offshore wind by 2030 while ensuring robust protection for our lands, waters, and biodiversity and creating good jobs."
- 2. Sec. 216. Conserving Our Nation's Lands and Waters. This establishes a "goal of conserving at least 30 percent of our lands and waters by 2030." We note the focus in on "conserve" as opposed to "protect" but the E.O. does NOT define conserve. There is a very truncated timeline by which NOAA has to initiate efforts (involving the Councils, fishermen, etc) on "how to make fisheries and protected resources more resilient to climate change, including changes in management and conservation measures, and improvements in science, monitoring, and cooperative research."

  AAFA will remain engaged as the E.O is implemented.
- 3. On May 6, the Administration published <u>Conserving and Restoring American the Beautiful</u> which lays out its vision for implementation of the 30 x 30 initiative. AAFA will remain engaged at all levels to ensure the Report's guiding principles and messages are not forgotten.

#### COVID-19

It goes without saying that COVID-19 has, is having, and will have profound impacts on the fishing industry. For purposes of this part of the Report – I will break down what has transpired by various groupings.

We provide the following, State specific, updates regarding disbursements from the \$300M included in the CARES Act from last spring.

• All west coast states have completed the application process for shares of the CARES Act \$300m from last spring Oregon.

The December Consolidated Appropriations Act included an additional \$300M in fisheries assistance (\$255M of which covers non-tribal or Great Lakes fisheries assistance). The allocations for the west coast states are as follows:

 California
 \$15,485,930

 Oregon
 \$13,487,797

 Washington
 \$40,000,000.

Each State will develop its own spend plan. We are engaged with the state of California and are helping inform their spend plan. We encourage folks to reach out to Oregon and Washington DFWs in order to get a feel for what they are planning this time around.

## North Pacific Albacore – Management Strategy Evaluation ("MSE")

The 5th Management Strategy Evaluation (MSE) Workshop for Managers Web Meeting for Canada and USA has been scheduled and will take place March 22 – 25 from 9AM until 12:30PM. A U.S. Stakeholder meeting has been scheduled for June 1, 2020 from noon – 2PM to discuss the results from the MSE workshop.

## **US – Canada Pacific Albacore Treaty**

- We just completed the first year of a new three-year regime.
- As of May 2<sup>nd</sup>, there is no update of the status of the proposed MPA off the Canadian West Coast.
- A number of AAFA members and representatives participated in the Annual Data Working Group call on April 20.

## UN Intergovernmental Conference on Marine Biodiversity of Areas Beyond National Jurisdiction – ABNJ/BBNJ

• The Fourth Session of the Conference has been scheduled for August of this year. It is very likely that the change in Administration will result in increased U.S. participation and leadership in the BBNJ discussions.

#### **Domestic Management – PFMC**

- The PFMC is meeting in March and we do not envision that Albacore will be on the Agenda. The Council will be getting an update on Marine Planning (offshore wind & aquaculture).
- The PFMC will be reviewing all advisory subpanels starting in June. It is likely there will be opportunities for AAFA members to participate in the Council's management processes. We will keep folks informed as we learn more.
- The June meeting does have HMS items on the Agenda; but nothing specific to albacore at this time. Marine Planning, which includes offshore wind and aquaculture, will also be discussed.

## Wind farms – Generally

If you have not been following offshore wind off the West Coast, or think there is no way it will happen, it is time to start paying attention. We expect further actions off all three west coast states as they (with the federal government's blessing) pursue offshore wind energy.

- Since February, BOEM has taken the following: (1) announced the Vineyard Project was not formally withdrawn; it wasn't withdrawn at all; and (2) on March 8 announced they have completed the

- environmental analysis of the proposed Vineyard Wind I offshore wind project. RODA has been all over the news speaking about this.
- On February 24, the PFMC's Habitat Committee held a lengthy webinar which included an update about OSW off the US West Coast. The webinar met its max capacity of 100 participants, so many who had hoped to tune in, couldn't. The meeting is recorded is now viewable. The first part covers the Aquaculture Opportunity Area in Southern California. The second part was BOEM's presentation on offshore wind. The wind part begins at the 1 hour, 40 minute mark. I would suggest watching from that point to the 2 hour, 28 minute mark as it will give you a good idea where BOEM is in their process. In short: Wind Energy Areas are likely to be announced off the California Coast by the end of the Spring (this is the step before leasing; but will still take significant time). We should also expect additional Call Areas off the Oregon and California Coasts by the end of the year.
- On March 29, President Biden (flanked by the Secretarys of Commerce, Interior, Energy, and Transportation) announced an ambitious plan to ramp up offshore wind off the US. This plan establishes "a Target of Employing Tens of Thousands of Workers to Deploy 30 Gigawatts (30,000 megawatts) of Offshore Wind by 2030."
- The PFMC has created a new page devoted to offshore wind news Offshore Wind News Pacific Fishery Management Council (pcouncil.org).
- We have participated in a number of webinars/workshops related too offshore wind off the West Coast.

#### Wind farms off the California Coast

- Two bills were introduced which address offshore wind in California. SB 413 and AB 525. AAFA is following those and will engage when appropriate.
- There are two proposed pilot projects in California State Waters (just above Pt Arguello). We have already begun engaging with State Lands Commission Staff on this matter.
- Offshore Wind California put on a webinar on March 29 entitled Going Big on California Offshore Wind: Lessons from Europe on Economies of Scale. If interested, you can watch that here Going Big on California Offshore Wind: Lessons from Europe on Economies of Scale YouTube
- On May 25, the White House and the Governor of the State of California agree to accelerate wind energy offshore the central and northern coasts of California. See https://www.doi.gov/pressreleases/biden-harris-administration-advances-offshore-wind-pacific.
   The Humboldt Call Area appears ready to be called a Wind Energy Area which precedes leasing. The Morro Bay Call Area is proposed to be expanded which may lead to it having to be renoticed as a new Call Area; but I think the Secretary of the Interior has some discretion to modify boundaries under certain circumstances.

## Offshore Renewables off the Oregon Coast

- The Oregon Renewable Energy Siting Assessment (ORESA) mapping tool has been published. See Oregon Renewable Energy Review Maps | Galleries | Data Basin. I am not going to lie to you it is not very user-friendly.
- OR 3375, which is closely related to amended AB 525, passed out of the Oregon House on April 27 with a 56-0 vote.
- On May 12 & 13, BOEM and the State of Oregon held virtual informational meetings on offshore wind energy planning to share updates on current outreach and engagement activities to inform possible offshore wind energy leasing along the Oregon coast. #### Offshore Renewables off the Washington Coast

• On Friday, May 29, we heard that a developer was proposing for a 102 square mile offshore wind project off Grays Harbor. We are unaware if the location would be in Federal or State waters. Supposedly it is going to be presented to the WCMAC on June 8.

#### Other items which arose previously and continued through May 31, 2021.

- As a reminder if you encounter any net marked fish this summer, please report those here <u>Net-marked</u> <u>albacore (netmarkedalbacore.com)</u>.
- The California Air Resources Board continues to move forward with amending their commercial harbor craft regulations. The most recent version was released the evening of April 1. We have been engaging with ARB staff trying to get some clarification on some of the items. The final regulatory package wont go before the ARB until early next year.
- On May 11, the Illegal Fishing and Forced Labor Prevention Act was introduced. We are working to make changes to the portion of the bill related to expanded AIS requirements.
- Hawaiian longline fleet expresses concern re the Chinese fleet(s) <u>Hawaii's Fishermen Are Worried About China's Fleet</u>. So Is The Military Honolulu Civil Beat
- AAFA has been made aware of two separate actions initiated by Customs and Border Protection, in collaboration with USCG. One of these, focused <u>improper use of paper captains</u> and the other on failure to detain a non-citizen crewmember in accordance with the law. This will be discussed during the upcoming General Meeting before the season starts.
- We are tracking the following State legislation:
  - ✓ California AB 525 see above
  - ✓ California SB 413 Offshore wind assessments and establishing the California Energy Commission as the permitting authority
  - ✓ Oregon HB 3375 see above
